

Northern Go Tournament

Manchester, 7th September 2014

The Northern Go Tournament is taking place again this year as a single day, three round tournament on Sunday, 7th September, on the 4th floor of
The Bank of East Asia,
3-5 Charlotte Street,
Manchester,
M1 4HB

This is within easy walking distance of Piccadilly railway station and Piccadilly bus station. The three nearest Metrolink stations are St Peter's Square, Piccadilly Gardens, and Market Street – all equally convenient. Those coming by car should be aware that there are no cheap, all-day parking options in central Manchester, even on a Sunday!

No food will be provided, but a list of nearby eating establishments will be available. You are quite welcome to bring sandwiches. Coffee will be provided at minimal cost!

The tournament will be run using the McMahon system, with time limits of 50 minutes per player, and overtime of (20/5, then 30/5, finally 40/5). Komi will be 7.

A meal will be organised in a nearby Chinese restaurant for those wishing to eat together after the tournament.

Prizes:

The winner of the tournament will receive £100, and the runner-up £50. Cash prizes of £10 or £15 will be awarded to others winning 2.5 or 3 games respectively.
